4 1 Introduction

1.1 Instructions

1 Introduction

1.2 Intended Use

- The device is intended exclusively as an option for the printers of the DP4300M series for cutting suitable materials that have been approved by the manufacturer. Any other use or use going beyond this shall be regarded as improper use. The manufacturer/supplier shall not be liable for damage resulting from unauthorized use; the user shall bear the risk alone.
- Usage for the intended purpose also includes complying with that manual.
- The device is manufactured in accordance with the current technological status and the recognized safety rules. However, danger to the life and limb of the user or third parties and/or damage to the device and other tangible assets can arise during use.
- The device may only be used for its intended purpose and if it is in perfect working order, and it must be used with regard to safety and dangers as stated in that manual.

1.3 Safety Instructions

- Disconnect the printer from the electrical outlet before mounting or removing the cutter.
- The cutter may only be operated when it is mounted on the printer.
- Risk of injury, particularly during maintenance, the cutter blades are sharp.
- Work going beyond this may only be performed by trained personnel or service technicians.
- Unauthorized interference with electronic modules or their software can cause malfunctions. Other unauthorized work on or modifications to the device can also endanger operational safety.
- Always have service work done in a qualified workshop, where the personnel have the technical knowledge and tools required to do the necessary work.
- Warning stickers must not be removed, as then you and other people cannot be aware of dangers and may be injured.

1.4 Environment



Obsolete devices contain valuable recyclable materials that should be sent for recycling.

Send to suitable collection points, separately from residual waste.

The modular construction of the device enables it to be easily disassembled into its component parts.

- Send the parts for recycling.
- Take the electronic circuit boards to public waste disposal centers or to the distributor.

2 Mounting

Removing the Tear-off Plate

Before mounting the cutter the tear-off plate mounted on the printer must be removed.



► Fold down the tear-off plate (1), pull the axles (2) of the tear-off plate out of the holders (3) and remove the tear-off plate.

Mounting the Cutter

Attention!

Disconnect the printer from the electrical outlet before mounting or removing the cutter.



- ▶ Put snap arm (2) of the cutter (5) into the guide (1).
- Push the axles (3) into the holders (4).
- Fold up cutter (5) so that it snaps in on the printer.

3 Operation

3.1 Loading Material

- Fold down the cutter.
- ► Insert labels for tear-off mode ▷ Operator's manual of the printer. Place the media strip between the printhead and the drive roller, so that the front edge of the strip reaches through the cutter.



• Guide the labels (2) into the slot (1) and fold up the cutter.

3.2 Standard Operation

 Switch on the printer. The cutter performs a synchronization action.

Note!

The cutter will operate with continuous or die cut material. Use Easy Mark Plus labeling software to select the format and use the printer driver to adjust the cutter settings during printing.

Or, to adjust the cutter from the printer LCD, using continuous label material, press *Setup -> Labels -> Label sensor* the setting *Continuous media* has to be selected. Otherwise no synchronization cut is carried out.

Press . For synchronization the media will be moved forward and cut off.

That synchronization is not necessary when the printhead was not opened between print jobs, even if the printer was powered off between print jobs.

- Adjust cutter options in Easy Mark Plus
 - Select Print Document
 - Select the desired printer and press the properties button
 - · On the left hand side, select Accessories Options
 - · Select the Perforator option
 - Adjust settings as desired.

Recommended distance between full cuts is 1 inch. Smaller full cuts could cause labels to become jammed.

3.3 Cutting on Demand

In the "Cut on Demand" mode the print job will be split into steps, which can be released separately.

- Choose Printing > Print on demand = On.
 4. Adjusting Cutter Settings with Printer LCD.
- Send a print job.
- Press _____.
 The first label will be printed and cut.
- Press equal to print and cut the next label.

Note!

Cutter settings are for a specific printer and cutter combination. Changing the cutter may require re-adjustment to the cutter settings.

Cutter control is handled by printing from Easy-Mark Plus labeling software.

Attention!

Risk of injury. The cutter blades are sharp.

- 1. Remove the cutter from the printer.
- 2. Clean cutter with PTR-CLN cleaning kit.
- 3. Reattach cutter to printer.

6 Error Messages

Error message	Cause	Remedy
Cutter blocked	Cutter cannot return into its home position and stays in an undefined position	 Switch off the printer. Remove material. Switch on the printer. Restart print job. Change material
	No cutter function	 Switch the printer off and then on. If error recurs call service.
Media too thick	The cutter is unable to cut the labels but is able to return into its home position	 Press Cancel Change material.
